At Burgessville's fiftieth anniversary, among the greetings from friends was a letter from Mrs. Wesley West recalling the days when she and Mrs. Justus Cohoe, the first district president and secretary went about organizing institutes throughout Oxford County. On one of their journeys they got off the train in a pouring rain and there was no one to meet them so they walked to their meeting place-a walk that took them about three hours. Burgessville's anniversary celebration began with a noon dinner. Mrs. D. H.
