Today in History

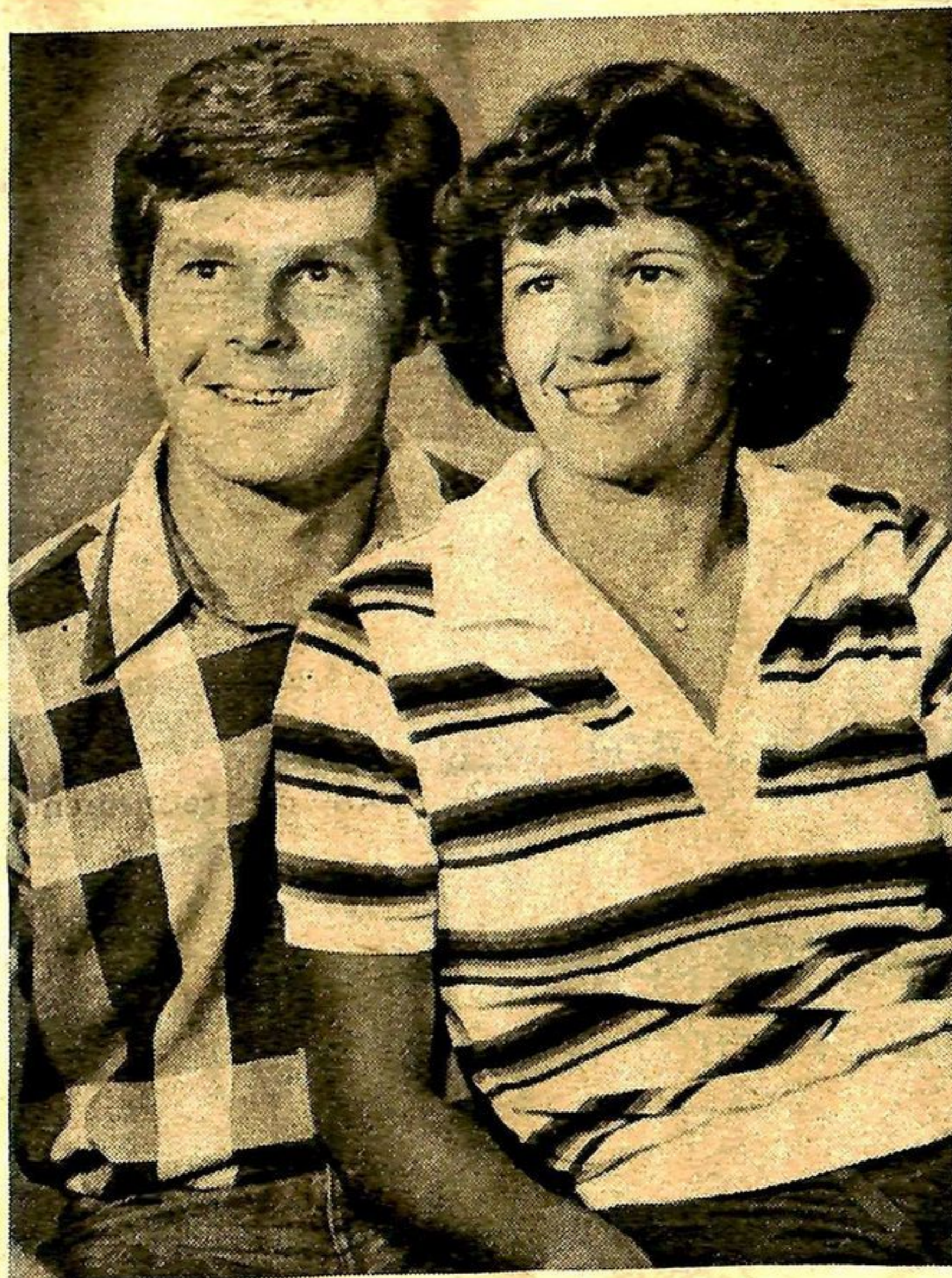

Hurricane Hazel roared into central and eastern Canada 25 years ago today - in 1954 - leaving 82 dead in the Toronto area alone. The hurricane, the worst recorded in Ontario, caused more than \$24 million worth of damage during its two-day rampage. It had been blowing itself out south of the border when a cold front from the north reactivated it over Lake Ontario, producing the heaviest rains in southern Ontario's history.
