


Roberts-Knott 1980

A most disastrous fire occured here yesterday destroying fifteen buildings. About 9 a.m. a dense smoke was seen to issue from the foundry of Mr. James Barr. The alarm was immediately given but the fire had made too great headway before the discovery to be. subdued. The shop of Hohn H. Walker, watchmaker, was wrapped in flames.
