The menu, the hours and the friendly service remain, however, effective September 9, 1994, Chesley Family Restaurant's ownership is a new partnership.


Bernice Murphy, who has been in Chesley for two-and-a-half years, has teamed up with her mother, Dianne Wells of Hanover, to run the restaurant.
