

It was in February of this year (1923) that, at the suggestion of Mrs. William Krug, the experiment of giving milk to the children in the lower rooms of the school was tried and has been continued ever since. Much credit is due to the teachers for the success of this work and for their cheerful co-operation. In April 1923 another three day Community Fair was held, the proceeds being \$645. The year ended with a balance of \$600.

For the year 1923-24 Mrs. Leitch was re-elected President for a third term and Mrs. W. G. Krug, Secretary-Treasurer. It was in September of this year that Sparrow's Hall was rented and was continually used until April 1937. Improvements were made to the Hall and a piano purchased for \$100. Special features of this year's work were a play entitled "Hickory Farm" realizing \$207. and a bale of clothing sent to Northern Ontario. A class in First Aid and Home Nursing, a class in Domestic Science were held.

The year 1924-25 Mrs. Leitch was elected President for the fourth year, with Mrs. W. G. Krug Secretary Treasurer. Beautifying Riverside Park was the chosen objective for this year's work. About \$400. was raised by a euchre party and another Community Fair. In November Mrs. Leitch resigned and Mrs. William Sutcliffe took office for the remainder of the term. A large sewing and dressmaking class was organized. Parties and sale of basket-work added \$130. to the funds. A rug was purchased for the Chesley Room in Bruce County Hospital, Walkerton.

The year 1925-26 Mrs. F. A. McLean was made President with Mrs. W. G. Krug re-elected Secretary-Treasurer. During the summer \$218. was spent in building and equipping a camp kitchen, erecting picnic tables and putting up swings for children. Under supervision of the Mayor and Mr. W. T. Kidd a bee was arranged, the underbrush cleared and a road built through the Park. This year about \$525. was expended on beautifying the grounds surrounding the Memorial, putting in shrubs, plants and 800 tulip bulbs. Money was raised by a lecture by Mr. C. J. Mickle, sale of baking, a play entitled "Green Stockings" by local talent. This year the Institute Cook Book was published and about \$118. realized from its sale. The year ended with a balance on hand of \$436.
