

The Devlin Branch of the Women's Institute was organized on the eight day of May in the year nineteen-hundred and eighteenth, at the home of Mrs. A. Beninger, under the guidance of Mrs. Wm Thompson of Emo, District President. This branch was formerly a part of the LaVallee-Devlin Branch which at that time disbanded into three separate branches. Fifteen members enrolled at this meeting and a staff of officers was elected.

The funds of the former branch, namely LaVallee Devlin, were divided equally among the three new branches and thereby Devlin received two-dollars and fifty-five cents in cash besides two Institute Pins.
