For a couple of years he followed shantying and then he bought a farm in Torbolton and married Miss Mary Dolan, the daughter of his nearest neighbour. Of this marriage, there were fourteen children, of whom four are dead. Mrs. Wilson is also dead.

Mr. Wilson's brother William married another Miss Dolan - Margaret. They also had a family of fourteen, all of whom are alive and hearty.
