

bewildering 20th century,"
Dewar said.

Outlining some of the projects of the institute over the years, Dewar stated most of these early activities and meetings were held in the log Goshen Hall.

In the days before hydro, institute members would walk to meetings with a stick of wood over their shoulder to build a fire for that necessary cup of tea. A piano was purchased and added a

festive mood to the meetings.

As the years climbed along in the 20th century, the farming demands noticeably changed and many residents left to seek employment in surrounding towns. Membership in the institute decreased.

Still, the institute thrived and these special ladies celebrated many anniversaries together. In 1950 the Goshen WI formed an orchestra and their musical talents became well known and sought after at many

local functions, area and national institute conventions.

Members of this famous band were Ruby Miller with her washboard, castanets and piano, Mrs Wesley Miller on the violin, Mrs Lawrence Seeley on Spanish guitar, Mrs Lorna Harper on Hawaiian guitar and Mrs Laura McLaren who played both the piano and violin.
