Dedicate New Building For Thamesford Church

THAMESFORD, June 16 — The dedication service of the new Christian education wing added to Westminster United Church was held at 3 p.m. Sunday.

The doors were officially opened by the church trustees. The dedication was conducted by the Rev. J. V. McNeely, of Woodstock. Prayer was offered by the Rev. S. R. Johnston, of Oxford Centre.

Speaker was the Rev. A. E. Duffield, of Lambeth and past president of the London Conference.

Dedicate Piano

A dedication of a piano was made by Dr. Howard Atkinson in memory of his daughter, Section-Officer Jean Burgess Atkinson, RCAF, and to members and adherents to this church who also give their lives in First and Second World War.

Total cost of the project was \$23,388. Color scheme is ivory, natural veneer and fibre glass partitions dividing the classrooms. An 18 by 20 foot stage with controlled lighting and spot lights is an interesting feature.

Co-operation of the members and men's and women's organizations of the church are responsible for much of the time and hard work given freely and voluntarily for the completion of the building, and working right along with the others was the energetic minister of Westminster United church the Rev. A. W. Meacham.
