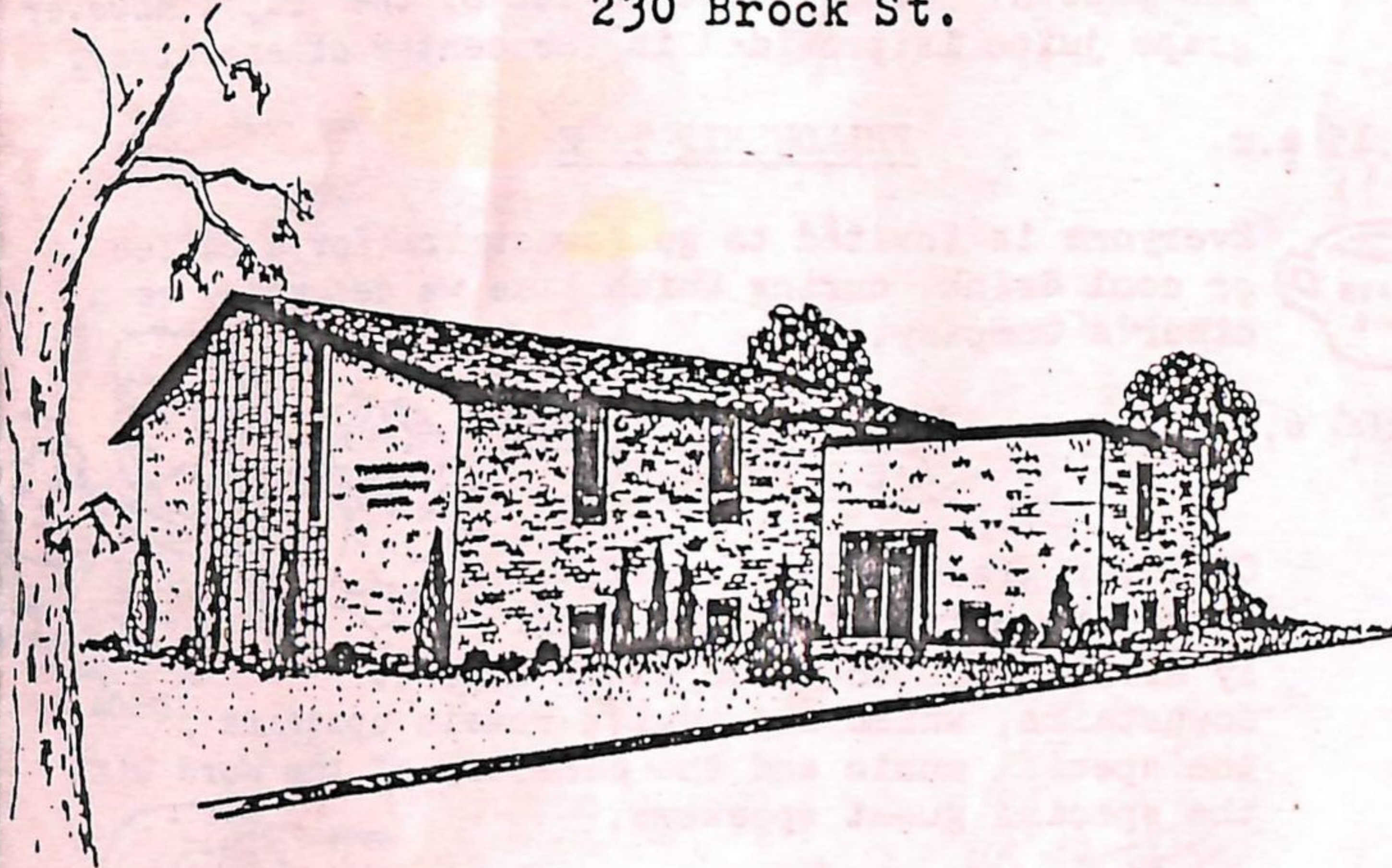

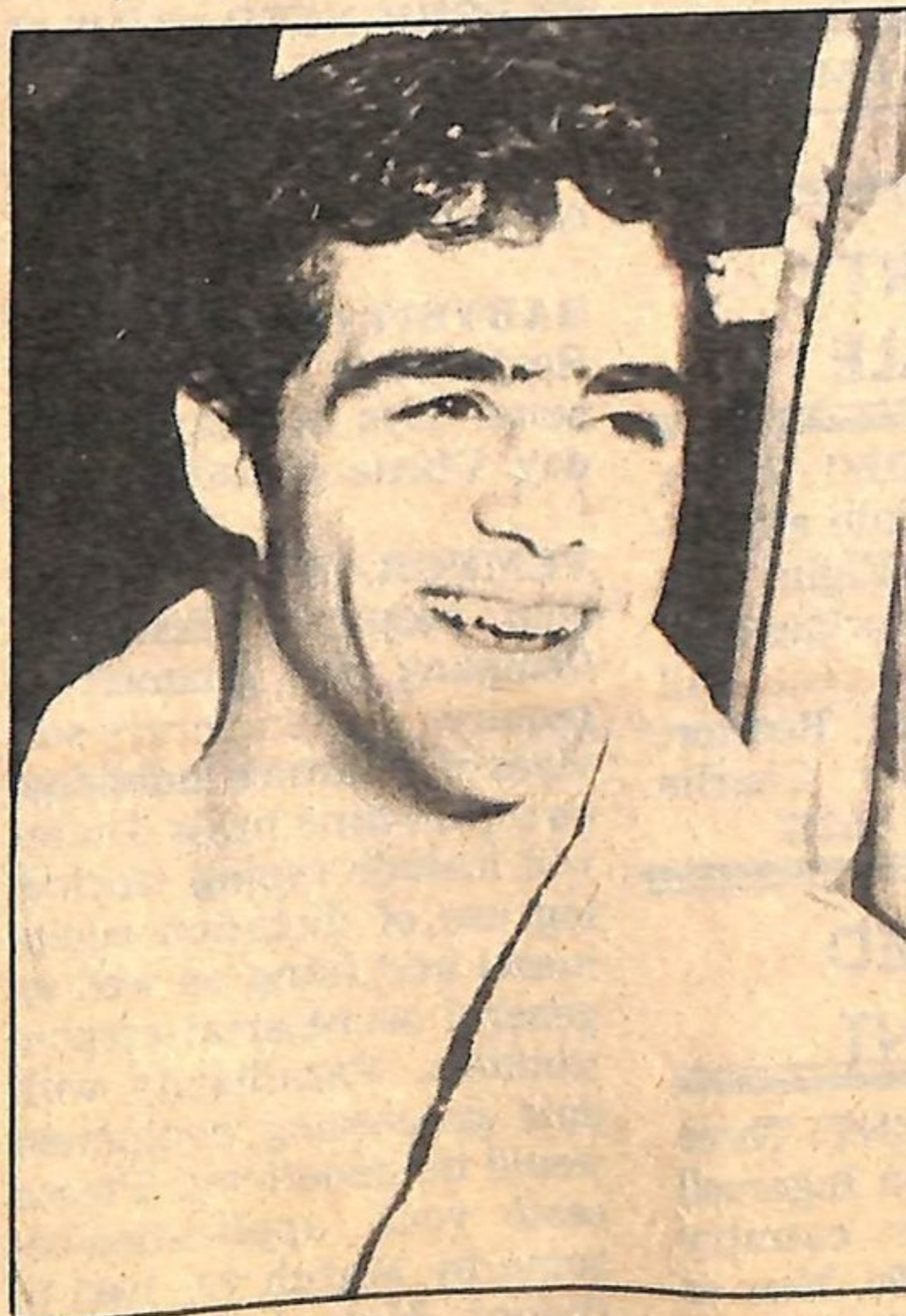
Sageman wins diving meet

Thamesford's pride and joy, Randy Sageman, did it again, showing the stuff that put him on the Canadian Olympic diving team by winning both his events in the Canadian University diving championships.

The competition held a little over a week ago at Brock University in St. Catherines, featured the University of Toronto student placing first in both one and three-metre board events.

His mother, Pat, informed The Times

that Mr. Sageman has also been named the Canadian university diver of the year for 1984-85, making the honor his for the fourth time in as many years.

Mrs. Sageman said that despite all the extra-curricular activities her son has been involved with in his years at the university, he's still managed to handle the academic load and will graduate this year majoring in commerce and economics.

Even after this past meet, the diver has little time to take it easy, as a national competition is slated for March 22 and 23 in Ottawa. If he does well there he may be off to China in May for the Internationals. Mr. Sageman is also hoping to find a spot for himself on the team going to the World Student Games, which will be held this summer in Japan.

Mrs. Sageman said that maybe part of the reason her son is doing so well has to do with the push by his teammates, as this year a number of them have really started to be divers of note themselves.
