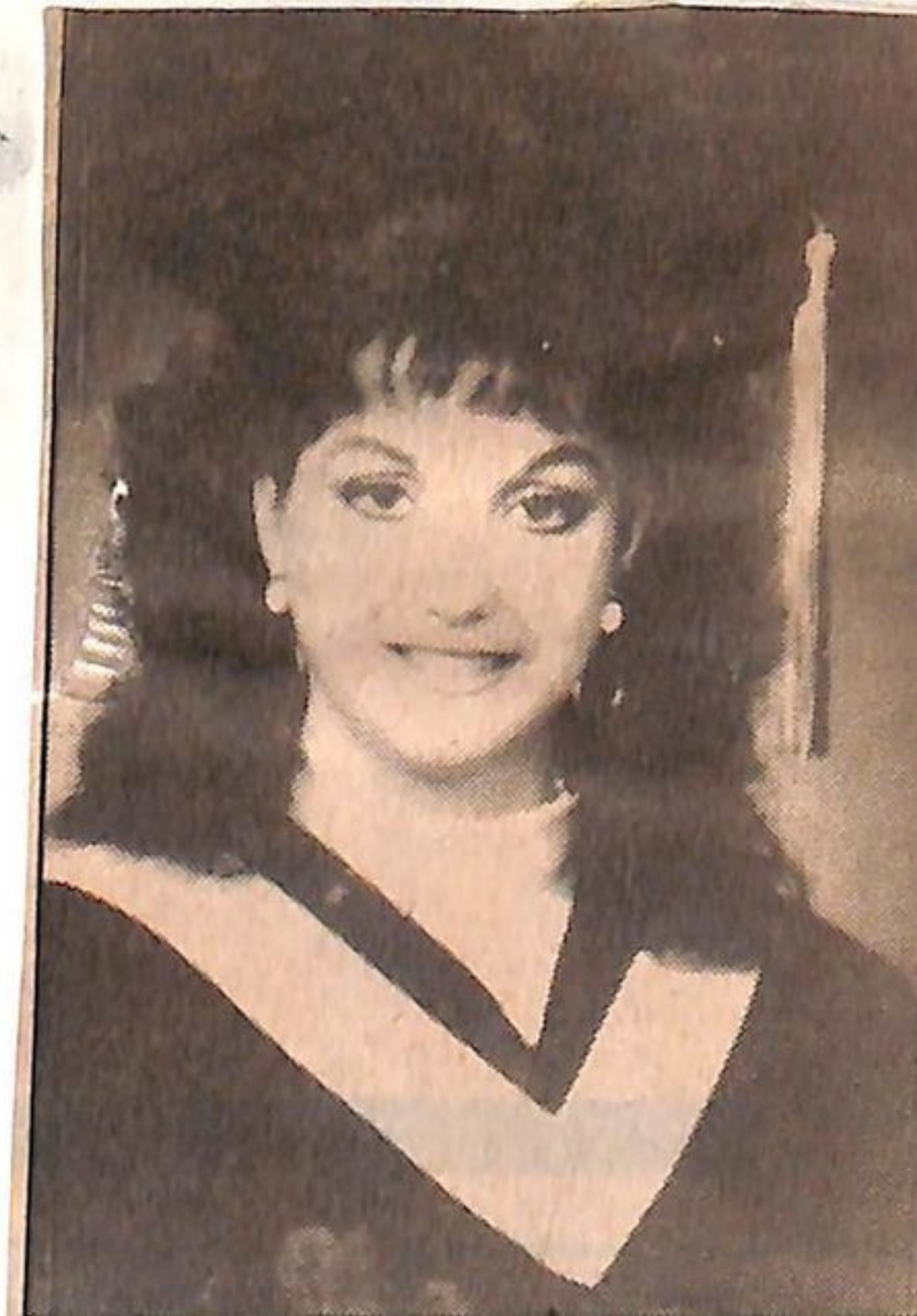

Bonnie Wideman was the 1988 winner of the J.B. Finlay award. Thamesfordites' Jennifer Beam and Rob House were also nominated.

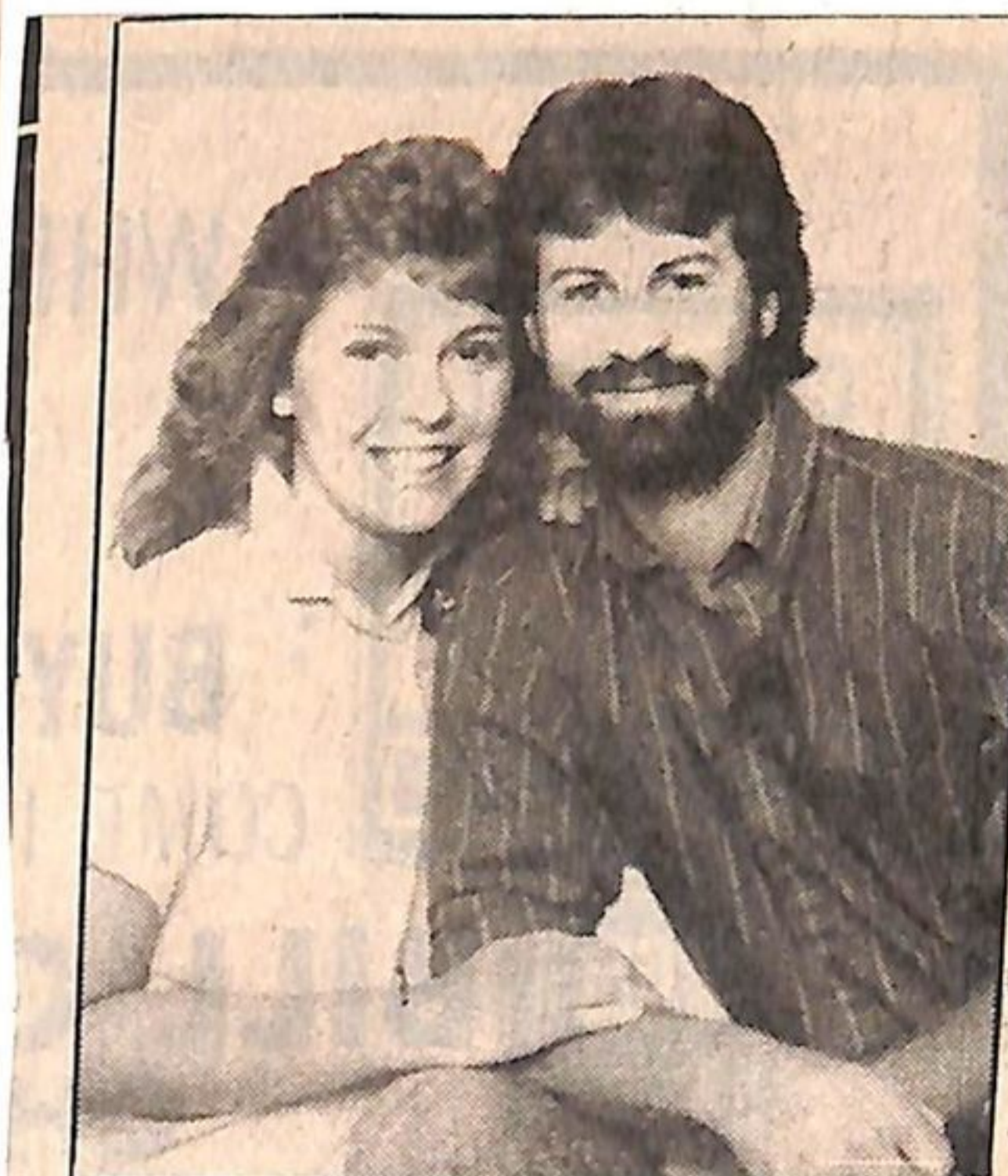
Janet Andrews and Lene Tonnisen were nominated for the J.C. Herbert Award.

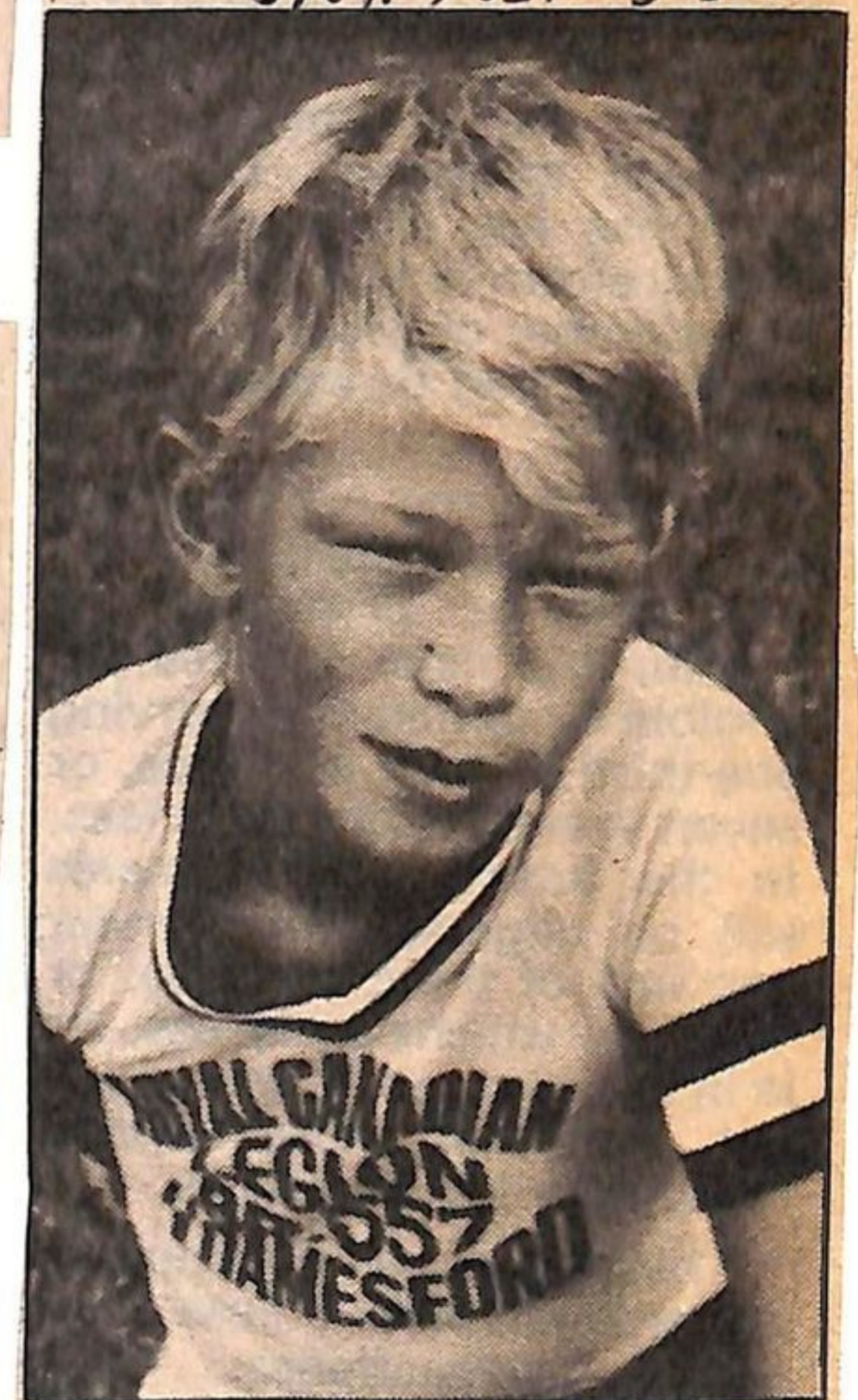
Pee Wee player profiles
