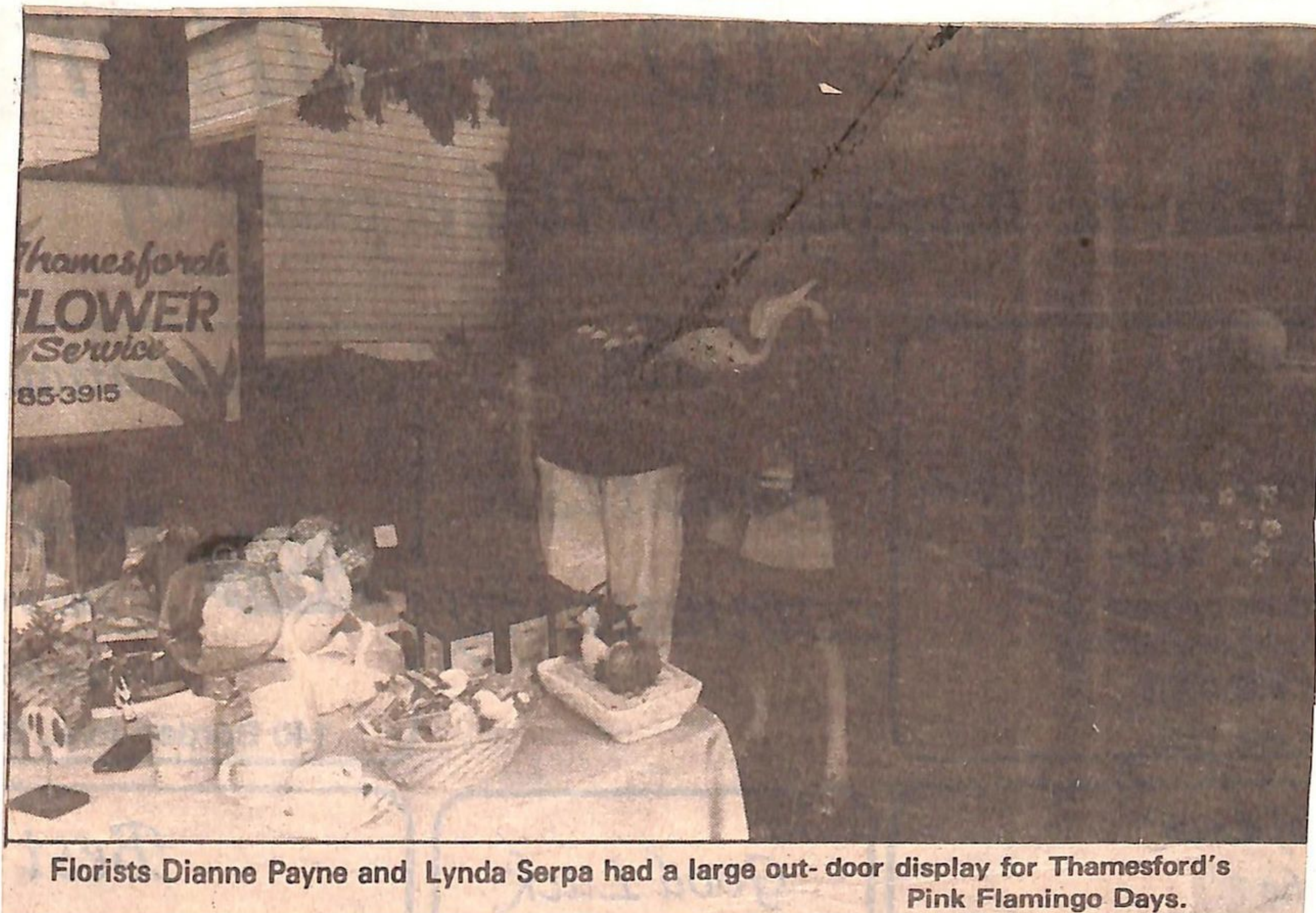
Store Manager Colleen Hoskins & Asst. Sue Pollock just
