By the 1850's the people in this district began building frame, brick and stone homes which were larger and more elaborate. Today, a hundred years later there are very few log buildings left standing even in a dilapidated state.

Of all the log homes built in this region none could be called pretentious and after three or four decades most were replaced by the homes which are standing today. These were fine structures of varying sizes and one especially was grand. This was the Adams' home built on lot 7 con. 13^{E. 7.} and it seems that no expense was spared in the construction. However the house was demolished in 1931 and its grandeur is only a legend now while some of the more humble abodes are still snug, comfortable residences.
