

November 14<sup>th</sup> 1938.

The regular monthly meeting of K. W. S. was held on Monday, 14<sup>th</sup> at 8 p.m. in Assembly Room of Public Library. Attendance 89. The President called the meeting to order, with the singing of "O Canada", Mrs Todd presided at Piano. The minutes of last regular & executive meetings were read and approved. The Programme, which was entitled "An evening with our Aborigines" was under the direction of Mrs S. V. Witté, in co-operation with Teachers from Cecilia Jeffrey Indian School. With a few introductory remarks, Mrs Witté announced the various items on the programme, as follows:— Indian War Dance by Norman Meecham, a Cornet & Euphonium Duet by Two girls, a vocal trio by Three girls, a Dance by a brother & sister, and vocal number by MacDonald children of all ages. A Cornet Solo with an encore number was played by Donald Morrison, who is one of the shining lights of the famous Cecilia Jeffrey School Band.

Mrs H. Martin, cleverly made up as an Indian maid, thrilled the audience with ~~her~~ excerpts from "Hiawatha" <sup>in costume,</sup> and Miss Grace Finlay also entertained with one of Pauline Johnson's readings. Miss Ida Wilson Teacher of Handicraft etc. drew attention to the Articles on Display — all of which were made by the school children. In spite of the home-made fret work <sup>saw.</sup> machine, the boys had turned out some
