

Nov. 1936 A furniture refinishing class had been held at the home of Mrs. George Sims.

25 Mar. 1937 Hannah McLeod, Mrs. F. R. Thornton, Mrs. Gould, and Mrs. Irvine were chosen to be in charge of a "Yell" to be given at the District Annual to be held at Drumbo on May 21.

24 June 1937 Hannah McLeod, Mrs. Ironsides, Nora McDonald, Jessie Henderson, Helen Knight, Mrs. Robson and Margaret McKay were to be a committee to be in charge of a Float for (Old Boys' Parade in Kintore on July 3).

Aug. 1937 Five girls displayed dresses they had made at the first class for Club girls as we know it today. Mrs. F. R. Thornton was the leader, with Jessie Henderson, Nora McDonald, Margaret McKay, Helen Knight, and Eleanor Gregory being the girls.

25 Mar. 1938 It was suggested that a paper on (Household Budgeting) given at a previous meeting by Mrs. Lindsay Calder be sent to the department.

3 Aug./39 Flossie Phillips and Helen Knight gave an account of their trip to San Fransisco and the World's Fair.

4 Nov./39 Mrs. Thornton the District President for North Oxford explained (Voluntary Registration). Programs this year featured (Mary Stewart Collect) for the first time.

7 Jan./41 Hannah McLeod concluded a series of lessons on (Buymanship).

A Community Concert was put on in the Hall on 28 March 1941 with three plays directed by Mrs. Harvey Irvine, Miss Nora McDonald and Mrs. Perry Whetstone as well as musical numbers. During the war work was done for Overseas. Roll Call for one of the meetings was a (Common Sugarless Recipe).

30 Dec. 1941 The Institute Meeting was held in the home of Mrs. Frank Leslie. This was one of the first meetings to be held in a private home.

27 May 1943 Miss Elsie Murray of the Univ. of Western Ontario gave an outline of Historical research and what to collect for the Tweedsmuir Village History.

Why they came Fairs and Markets
How long did the original family stay
Local Institutes Records of Churches
Beginnings of Agricultural Societies, etc.
