Many photos were separated and chosen to comprise a story for presentation on March 6,2002 of Lakeside Village community life at that time. Prepared by D.E. The Lakeside Community was a hub of activity at this time with the operation of two General Stores to serve the area plus both maintaining fuel pump gas service.

**The village had a doctor, supported two church's, a mill for livestock chop, a blacksmith, a water tower, barber, telegraph facilities, Royal Mail Post Office with general delivery, a one room school house and teacher, railway service plus a C.P.R. Station. There were Ladies Institutes, clubs, Ladies Aid, forerunner to the United Church Women, Anglican Women's Association, Mission Band, Young Peoples, The Orange Lodge and The Fraternal Order of Masons (Doric Lodge 569). The village had a pool hall, a summer dance pavilion and Lake Sunova, a spring filled lake with fishing/recreational swimming and the name for the village itself.
