THE STATION ROBBERY

The Station Robbery
 Wednesday morning last,
 C.P.R. Agent D. E. Wilson was
 breakfast, the depot was broken into
 and \$471.50 taken. On his return Mr.
 Wilson missed the money, and seeing
 a man in the distance striking for St.
 Marys along the railway ties, gave
 the alarm and a number of farmers
 at once responded, and catching up
 to the man at the crossing, in Reeve
 Alex Smith's car, invited him to take
 a ride, of which privilege he gladly
 availed himself. They had not gone
 far when they had a break-down, and
 Mr. Clark's car with a number of
 neighbors coming along, they were all
 transferred and soon were at the out-
 skirts of St. Marys, without any sus-
 picion on the part of the burglar that
 he was being made prisoner. They
 were met by Chief Young and Jack
 Thompson, who had responded to a
 telephone call from Medina. Arriving
 in St. Marys the suspect was brought
 before Police Magistrate W. R. Butcher
 and on his possession was found
 \$471.50. He was remanded for a week
 to look up his record and has been
 confined in Stratford jail in the mean-
