There will be a Christmas Eve Service at Christ Church (Lakeside) on Sunday, December 24th at 8 o'clock p.m. Everyone Welcome.

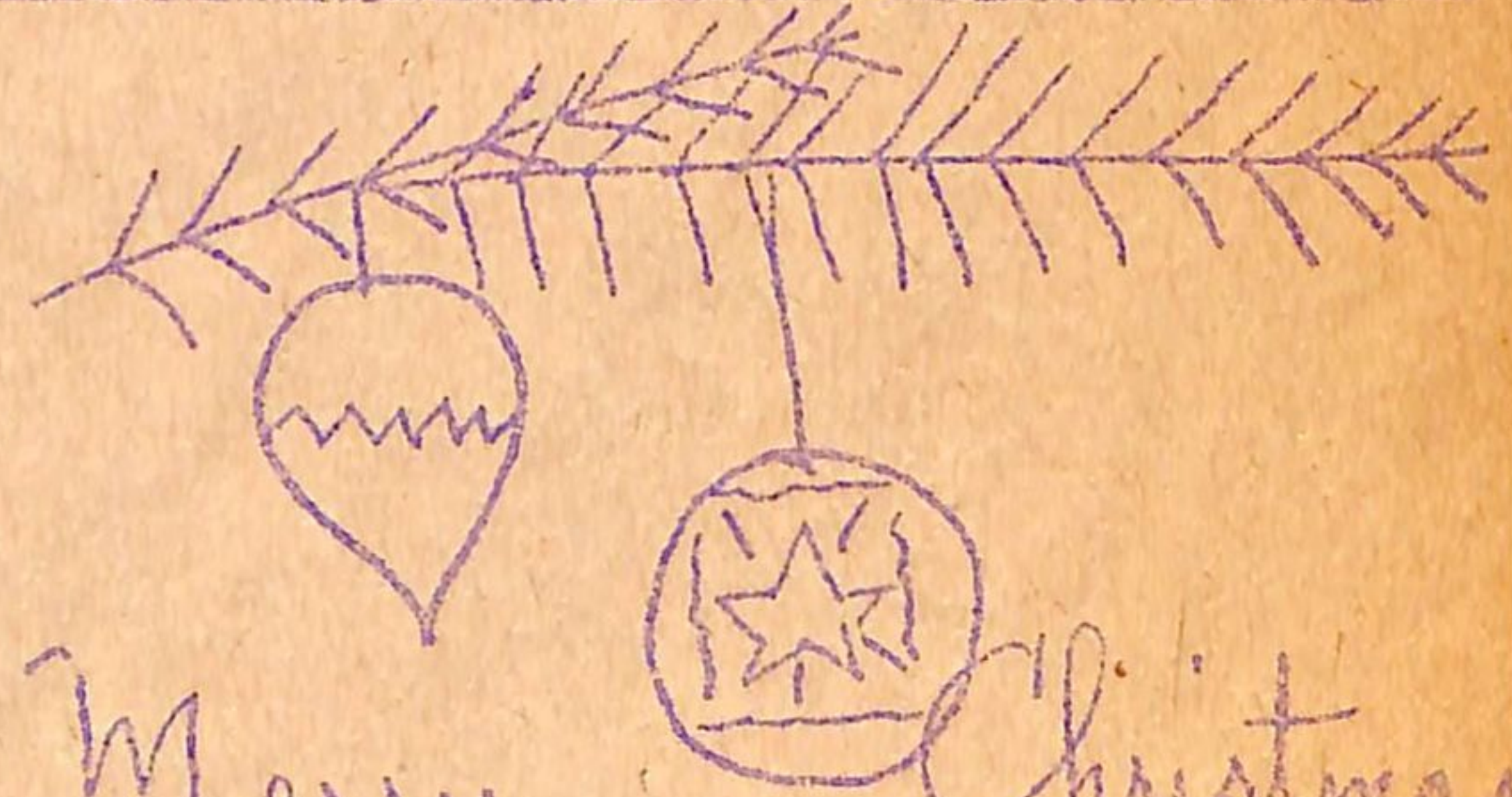
## Poetry Corner
