Bob Baker, Victim of Accident

Lakeside and area residents were shocked and saddened as they heard the tragic news of the tractor accident which killed Robert (Bob) Rockland Baker, 36, of R.R. 3, Lakeside, Wednesday afternoon, October 2.

Bob was driving a tractor, owned by Douglas Gates of Salford, on the Lakeside sideroad, near Brooksdale. The tractor equipped with a front-end loader, struck a bump in the gravel road and pitched over, knocking Bob off. The tractor then rolled on its side, pinning the driver.

Besides his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Baker of R.R. 3, Lakeside, Bob is survived by one sister, Georgina of British Columbia.

The body is resting at the L.A. Ball Funeral Chapel, St. Marys until Saturday, October 5, when funeral services will be held at Christ Church (Anglican) Lakeside at 2 p.m. Interment in the Anglican cemetery.

Sincere and heartfelt sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.
