Recipe of The Week

OLD FASHIONED DOUGHLUTS

- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 3 tablespoons shortening or lard
- 1 heaping teaspoon soda
- 1 heaping teaspoon baking powder
- 2 heaping teaspoons cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon each of lemon and vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon flour to roll out

Beat the eggs well, add the sugar gradually while beating. Add milk, flavouring and the melted lard and lastly the sifted flour and dry ingredients. It will take about 5-1/2 cups of hard wheat flour - more may be needed. Cut and fry in hot fat. These keep well and seem to improve with age.
