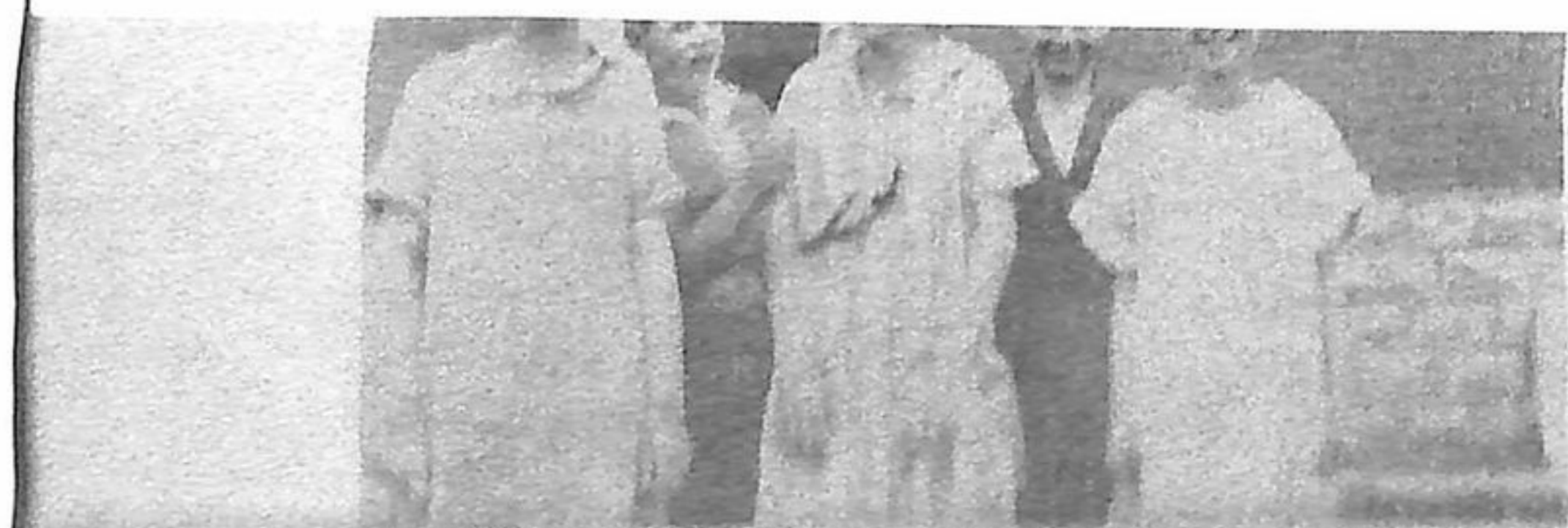

In 1864, School Section No. 3 of West Zorra was organized. The following is the report of the record of organization:-



was held at the home of George Macdonald for the purpose of choosing a site for a school house. It was decided that a frame school could be built for \$100 less than a brick building a frame school was to be erected. It was decided later to build a brick school. The first school was built by James Muir whose tender was for four hundred and thirty-two dollars.
