

## Well-Known Lakeside Area Resident Dies In Hospital

LAKESIDE: Francis Wilfred Seaton died suddenly at Victoria Hospital, London, on Tuesday, September 24. He was born on lot 26 con. 13 in the township of East Nissouri in 1900, the youngest son of F. G. Seaton and Mrs. Seaton the former Mary Sutherland.

He attended Lakeside public school and Woodstock Collegiate Institute. He had served as warden of Christ Church, and at the time of his death, was chairman of East Nissouri Cancer Society for Oxford county, and secretary treasurer of Doric Lodge AF and AM Lakeside.
