HISTORY OF VILLAGE - STARTS AT Page 11

1- At November meeting 1908 -  
Mrs Gaudier and Mrs W. B. Moore  
were appointed to attend the  
Provincial Convention at Guelph  
on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup> + 10<sup>th</sup>

The delegates had to leave on the  
morning of Dec. 8<sup>th</sup> about 7 a.m.,  
travelling to Winton in a completely  
covered-in sleigh, drawn by team  
of horses, the horses having to  
be replaced by a fresh team at  
what was called "The Half-way  
house", which was located about  
two miles south of the present-  
Hope Bay Post Office. This change  
gave the passengers a chance to  
get warm if they wanted to be-  
fore proceeding on another two  
hours' drive. The operator, at that  
time of this "stange-coach", was  
George Hummel, and he did  
every thing he could for the comfort-  
of his passengers. Foot-warmers  
were provided, and when dark  
the enclosure was lighted by a
