The first-delegates sent to the Guelph Convention were Mrs (Rev.) Gaudier and Mrs W. B. Moore in the year 1908. - December 9 + 10. Delegates had to leave Lion's Head 7 A.M. - on the morning of the 8th, travelling in a covered sleigh to Wexford. The driver, Mr. George Hummel provided foot-warmers, making his passengers as comfortable as possible.

In 1883 Eastern Township made arrangements with the Government to clear the channel - and to build a dock at Lion's Head. A dredge was sent by the Government and cleared the channel - 13 ft. deep and 80 ft. long through a bar extending across the entrance to the harbour and built a pier some 200 ft. long was constructed in 1884.

Pioneer Settlement -

Before the village of Lion's Head had taken form what was known as Jackaber's Corners Concession 4 and 5 - was looked upon as the hub of the Township.
