The Rev. Mr. Seggett, a Methodist minister was the first minister to attend to the spiritual needs of the people. x

The Presbyterians entered the field a little later but met with strong support and erected the first Church edifice in the Township. Rev. W. N. Rogers in 1879. Followed by Mr. M^r Gibbon a student from College in summer of 1880. Before the Church was erected services were held in the summer in the old Webster mill, and in the winter at the home of Robt. Watt, where also was held the first tea-meeting in the settlement. A Mr. Mann, another student filled the field in the summer of 1881 and in 1882 the Rev. Mr. M^r Lennan was inducted as pastor of the congregation. The Church 22' x 40' ft. in size having been dedicated May 22, 1881.

By Jan. 10, 1903, the Church was self-sustaining when the Rev. J. A. Nelson was inducted as pastor.

Christ's Church, Sion's Head, quoted from Historical Sketch on sixtieth anniversary - 1943: - In the year 1882 - The Rev. Mr. Hutcheson journeyed to Sion's Head to try to get-together a band of people to form the foundation of an Anglican Communion.

from book. - In 1921 the job of bricking the Church and building solid stone masonry with brick veneer on the west-front was completed, and the edifice greatly strengthened. The money for this undertaking was raised by the efforts of the "Willing Workers" - the women's organization of the Church - now called the "Ladies Guild".
