From surveys made in 1922 + 1923 of the Bruce Peninsula by nurses from the Dept. of Health, Toronto, and by Dr. Fraser, Guelph, who was Medical Health adviser for this district, a recommendation was made by them to the effect that Sion's Head was a good center to establish a Red Cross Hospital from which health inspections of all the school children in the district could be carried on.

The Sion's Head Women's Institute took the matter up and a committee was appointed to find out what possibilities there were in getting a building. A few rooms in a private home were offered, but that idea was not acceptable to the Red Cross, so the matter was dropped.

Mrs. Dr. Foster W. Carter, who was then the District President of the Institute, brought the matter up at the

Annual District-meeting, and a resolution was passed for the Secretary - Miss Stella Whitcher of Colpoys Bay - to write to the Red Cross that if the District Women's Institute could raise one thousand dollars towards an Out Post hospital at Sion's Head, how much could the Red Cross do. The reply was that if a suitable building could be found - all that would be expected of the Dist. Institute was that they would pay the rent and supply the fuel, the Red Cross would ^{beget} all other expenses until the ~~work~~ ^{hospital} was established.

By that time Miss Ethel Boyle was moving away from Sion's Head, and a committee from the Dist. got in contact with her to see if she would rent her house, and Mrs. Foster called a meeting of the directors to be held at
