

Miss Boyle's, and the Red Cross sent Miss Wilkinson from Toronto to attend the meeting.

It was decided to rent the house and some of the furniture at \$12⁰⁰ per month.

Some alterations were made by putting in partitions. The Red Cross sent all necessary hospital furniture and supplies.

Miss Lawrence was the first nurse to take charge of the hospital.

The opening was held in October, 1924. Miss Wilkinson returned for the opening, - and Mrs Wm. Simpson represented the Lobermoy Institute.

In 1931 the building where the Hospital now is was bought by the Lion's Head Red Cross Branch from Symon Pacey, and the mortgage was paid off in a few years.

Many improvements have been made to the building. Furnace was put in, hydro, running hot and

cold water, bath-room with tub-wash-bowl and toilet-up stairs and a toilet-and wash bowl down stairs, and deep sink with running water in the operating room. Many shelves and cupboards have been built inside and a sun-porch to the front of the building.

At the beginning there was just a Hospital committee appointed by the District-W.D., and the bills were paid by the District-Secy-treas, who was then Miss Stella Whitaker, now Mrs Gatis of Colpoys Bay.

By 1928 the Red Cross Branch was formed here and were given their charter in 1932.

Grants are received from the County now amounting to \$250⁰⁰ per year. The local Branch pay for insurance, fuel, hydro, linen, care-taker, telephone rental, indigent accounts, repairs, new furniture as it is needed
