The 12 judges at Arran Tara Elementary School's science fair must have had quite a time picking winners from the 138 exhibits. Seventeen entries in the Junior and Intermediate categories were to be chosen to go on to the regional science fair which will be held at the G.C. Huston School in Southampton this year. Winners at the county level will take their entries to the Canada-wide science fair in Newfoundland.

The junior category is made up of grades four to six and the seniors are in

grades seven and eight. A science project is optional for the grade fives and sevens. School science teacher Rod McEachnie said there was a good response from the grade sevens this year. Seven intermediate winners were chosen and ten were picked in the senior category.

Many of the offerings were the products of current concerns such as Ozone, AIDS, and Acid Rain. Some of the topics covered were in the realm of pure science such as Acids and Bases, Ornithology, and Microscopes. Several pro-

jects dealt with soil erosion.
