Take Month To Probe Plane Crash

WOODSTOCK, Ont. (CP) — A federal investigator said today it will take a month before a cause is found for Sunday's airplane crash at nearby Eastwood in which four members of a Wiarton, Ont. family died.

Reg Phillips of the aircraft accident investigation branch of the department of transport said in an interview there is a great deal of data to be compiled to find out why the single-engine Cessna aircraft crashed in a farm field about five miles east of Woodstock.

Killed were provincial police constable Carl Monk, his wife, and two teen-aged sons.

The family was en route to Wiarton from Brantford when the accident occurred.

Mr. Phillips said tape recordings, weather conditions and other factors must be considered to establish cause.

Meanwhile, Joseph Pember, a Woodstock ambulance operator and also an alderman, said Tuesday in an interview that he wants extra funds from the province to build a special sled for winter rescues in the area.

Because of the remoteness of Sunday's crash site, and blinding snow, ambulances were stuck three-quarters of a mile away from the site, he said.
