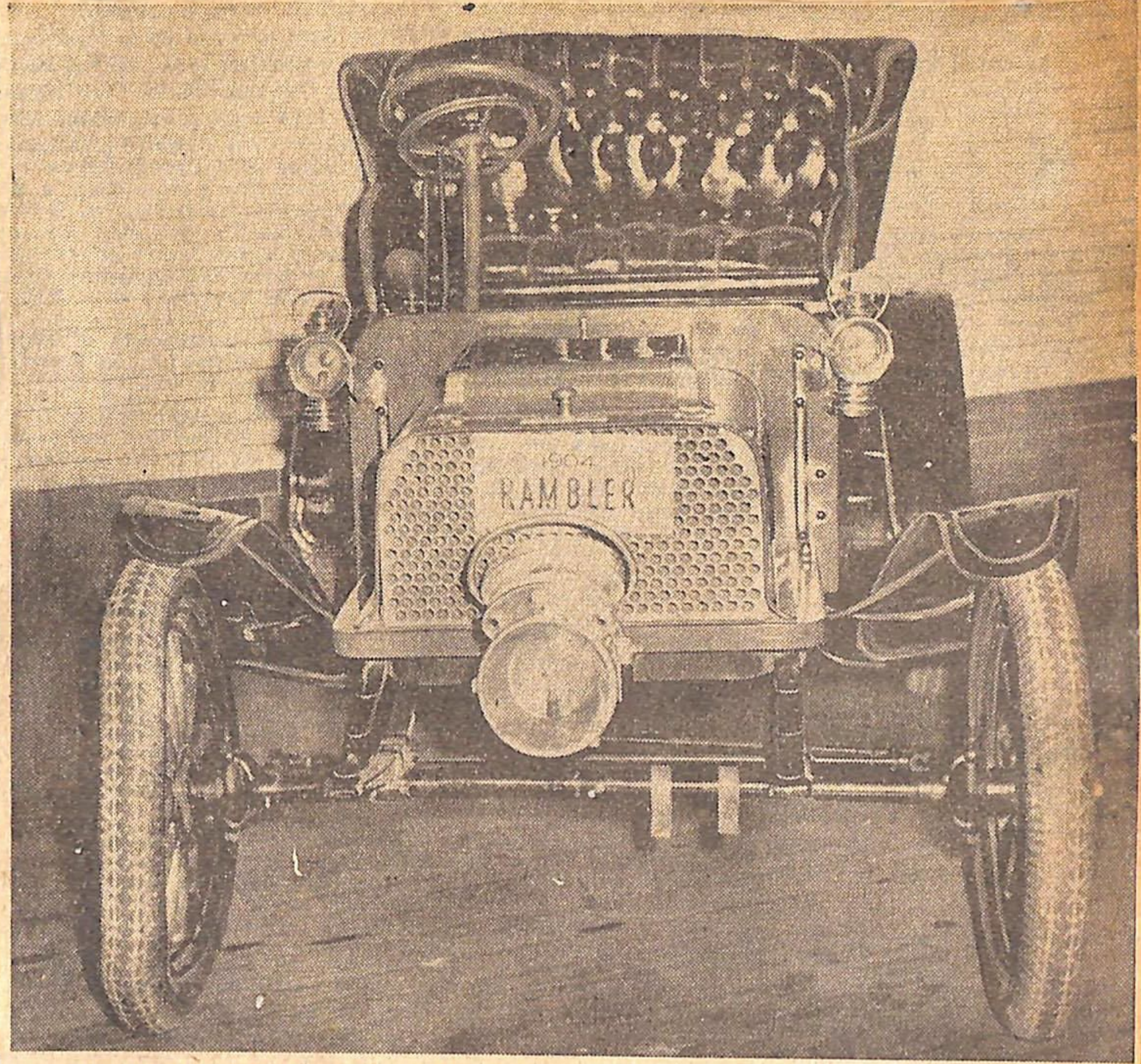
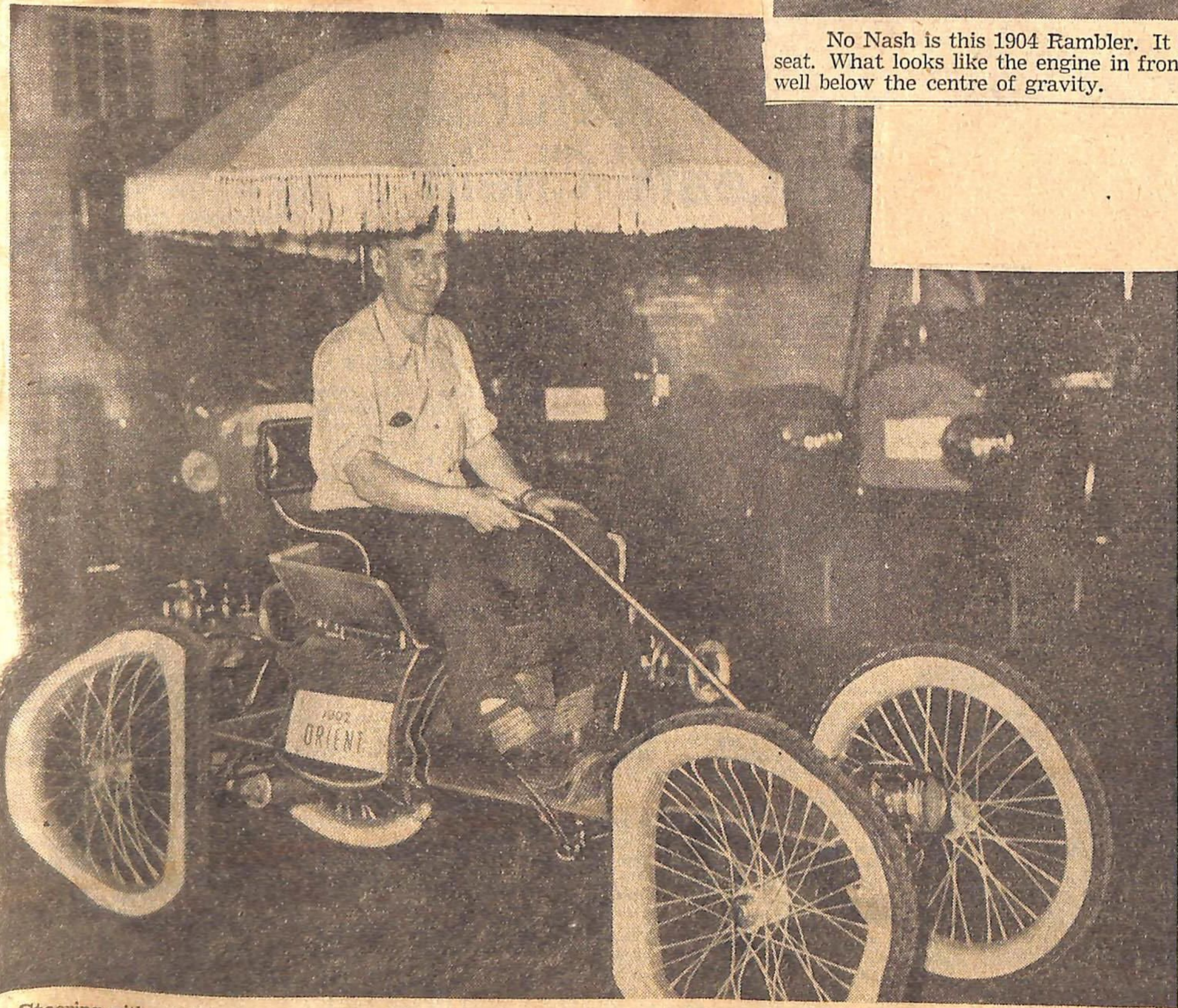


Horseless Carriages Chug Into Casa Loma Stables PSBL-7



No Nash is this 1904 Rambler. It has a one-cylinder engine installed under the seat. What looks like the engine in front is the gasoline tank. Searchlight is mounted well below the centre of gravity.
