

This was seconded by Mrs A. P. Wilson and carried.
Mrs Poe of Cochrane gave the report on War work from eleven branches who had raised and voted over \$800. for war work besides doing a creditable amount of knitting and sewing and sending parcels to soldiers. She recommended more complete records kept of articles made and donated. Mrs Poe moved that her report be adopted. Mrs Warwick seconded her motion. Carried.

The Publicity report sent in by Mrs Carboneau consisted only of one report of the Hearst Branch which gave us all suggestions of the way in which the end of the work can be carried out by wearing the Institute pins, by newspaper publicity for our meetings and activities, by letting individual officers know by mail of meetings.

Mrs Jack of Timmins read the report of six branches on historical research and current events. The history of the Public school and Women's Institute has been written at several Current Events and a discussion of new industries brought to Canada during the war has taken an important part at our meetings. Mrs Jack moved the adoption of her report and this was seconded by Mrs Ash.

Edith Phillips, of Clute, who is stationed at the mess room at Gravelly, then spoke for a few minutes, mentioning that the course she took at Ottawa was simply a review work to her, as she had covered the ground-work in her Girls Club and Local leader and that course in nutrition in the Womens Institute.
