Presidents met here

When the national and provincial presidents of the WI met with the president of the international parent body, the Associated Country Women of the World, the Expositor learned how the three women first became involved in working with country women.

Mrs. Farquharson who is a widow, became involved with the ACWW partly because of her husband's business.

"My husband was a book publisher and we lived in the country. The wife of one of his authors invited me to a meeting of the association. That was in 1938."

Mrs. Farquharson has since taken her husband's place in the company and also sells advertising space in scientific journals.

Mrs. Fulton, national president arrived in Canada on Valentine's Day 1945. She was born

in England and now lives in Birtle, Man. Her husband is a mixed (cattle and grain) farmer. She has three sons. She was a part-time nurse and may return to her profession.

Her involvement with the WI started as the result of a bridal shower given her in Manitoba. One of the gifts was a paid membership in

the local WI.

"I was involved with the WI before I was born," said Mrs. Noblitt, and went on to explain that her mother, Mrs. Leslie Phillips, was an organizer for the WI in Alberta. Mrs. Noblitt's husband is a mining engineer and the couple has one daughter.
