Mrs Dass, Consecon, sang "Bonnie Prince Charlie" by request. "How the Institute may co-operate with the Agricultural Representative" was shown by Mr Roy Atkin in his address. Miss Lafferty and Mr W.D.Reid each gave a reading. After singing the National Anthem the meeting adjourned.

Morning session October 27th.

This session opened at 9.00 o'clock with Mrs. B. Finkle presiding. Silent prayer The Lord's Prayer and Institute Ode used in opening.

The report of the standing committee on Health prepared by Miss F. Barker, convener was read in her absence by Mrs Harris. Miss Hopkins of Dept. of Agr. W.I. Branch, explained re school lunch prizes and gave talk on proper food for the lunch. Miss E. Guest in the absence of Immigration report gave a number of recommendations re this branch of service and appealed for support.

Agriculture This report was presented by Mrs. Robert McCulloch, convener. The activities included co-operation with school fairs and agricultural fairs.

Community Activities report Mrs. M. E. Maybee, convener. reported a variety of work undertaken by the branches in their communities. Solo - name not recorded.

"Work with and for the Girls" was the subject of an inspiring address by Miss Chapman, assistant Sup.W.I. She stressed the educational, social and spiritual.

Home Economics and Legislation Reports Mrs. W. R. Munro presented these reports which contained many suggestions for future work. General discussion followed.
