One of the ACWW projects is the collection of funds for the development of Women's Institutes in other countries. This project is known as "Pennies for Friendship" and it is hoped that it will collect $8\frac{1}{2}$ million pennies during 1979-80 for this purpose and also to finance the Flag Tour.

One of the Flags was presented to Mrs. C. Diamond by the ACWW President at Council last July in England, and is to be returned when ACWW meet in Hamburg, Germany in May 1980.
