Union Refuses To Support Ship Strikers

MONTREAL (CP) — Striking crew members of the British freighters Cibou and Shell Drake learned by a telegram Tuesday they will have no support from their union—the National Union of Seamen of Great Britain—in their fight for higher wages.

The 30-man Cibou crew struck Monday partly to enforce their own wage demands and partly in sympathy with the 18 Shell Drake seamen, arrested two days previously for allegedly refusing their captain's orders to put to sea.

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
