gallows early today to Ontario's "hot stove" murder case as three men hanged for the torture slaying last July of Mrs. Viola Jamieson in her home

at Flanders, Ont. The brothers Skrypnyk, 38-year-old George and 23-year-old Anthony of Atikokan, Ont., and 29-year-old William Schmidt of Fort Frances, paid with their lives for what was once described by a police official as one

of Ontario's most ghastly crimes. A news blackout was clamped on proceedings at the jail as the hour for the executions approached. It learned that the last man was pronounced dead at 12.50 a.m. E.S.T. by jail surgeon Dr. W. G. Boyle and coroner Dr. D. B. Young. A five-man
