Being Laid Today

charges were expected to be laid today against Patrick Doland Critton, 24, of New York City, identified Monday as the suspected hijacker of an Air Canada DC-9 flown to Cuba Dec. 26.

Amendment Is Drafted

TORONTO (CP) — The Ontario government has drafted an amendment to the provincial Human Rights Code that would bring the rental of flats in houses under the jurisdiction of the code, Labor Minister Gordon Carton said Tuesday.

Mr. Carton said the amendment to the code, which prohibits discrimination in rental of accommodation, will be introduced at the next session of the Ontario legislature.

He said in an interview that the proposed change would overcome a decision by the Supreme Court of Canada that found that flats in houses are not covered by the legislation because they are not self-contained.

Insp. George Wilson said there will be two charges of kidnapping, one covering the captain and first officer of the aircraft, and another covering the crew and stewardesses.

He said there would be an armed robbery charge for taking over the aircraft and an extortion charge for demanding the Cuban flight by use of threats.

All four charges are covered under the extradition agreement between Canada and Cuba. Hijacking is not covered.

A counsel for the attorney-general's office said formal announcement of the charges would be made in Ottawa.
