Schreiber Evidence "Points To Murder" Of Missing Men

While a bulldozer continued to buck heavy drifts along the seven mile stretch from Schreiber to the Cook's Lake mining property, believed to hold the fate of Joseph Grant and Marcel Duchesneau, Provincial Police here stated this afternoon that no further word had ben received from Inspector Frank Kelly, who is conducting the search for the two men.

Inspector Kelly, criminal investi- gator from Toronto, stated yesterday that evidence found by Constables Ivar Lellava and Harry Drackley two weeks ago when they visited the min- ing property pointed almost directly to murder. The two constables, who made the seven mile trip to the property on snowshoes, found the two men had been using as the mining operation headquarters a 16 by 20 foot log cabin. In the cabin the officers had discovered clothing of the type the two men would wear in the city. Still on the table where the two men
