TYPHUS SERUM SENT

\$360,000 IN HOLD-BACKS

Road Case Involves Nearly \$500,000

Nearly a half million dollars may be involved in penalties to Tomlinson Bros. Limited as a result of the brief trial at the Supreme Court assizes Monday at which the firm pleaded guilty to obtaining money on Department of Highways contracts "by deceit and falsehood."

In addition to the \$100,000 fine they have been ordered to pay by Mr. Justice Danis, the firm may be obliged to relinquish \$360,000 involved in two charges and now held by the province as "hold-backs" on other contracts with Tomlinson Bros. Limited.

Suspended Sentence

Levying the \$3,500 fine against Arthur M. Mills, former department engineer in Fort William, the justice said he was taking into consideration the fact that the crown was not pressing for a jail sentence. In the statements of defence counsel, "that government auditors could not find that any of the \$360,000 involved reached the person or hand of Mills." He also ordered a suspended sentence of 18

months for Mills plus six months in jail if the fine is not paid within one month.

The former engineer stood impassive as the sentence was handed down, but he was smiling as he left the court house later, the strain of waiting a year for his trial now ended.

Originally, he had been charged with defrauding the government and breach of trust in his capacity as head of the Fort William Department of Highways office. He pleaded guilty to the latter charge and the first count was dropped by the crown.

"It is inconceivable to me that the management of Tomlinson
