Hearing Is Slated OnMay31

The third Port Arthur man to be charged at Fort William this week in connection with Ontario highways irregularities, W. S. Tomlinson, vicepresident of Tomlinson Bros. Limited, was remanded this morning until May 31 on \$10,000 cash bail.

He was charged with conspiring with Arthur M. Mills, former Highways department division engineer. Cameron W. Taylor, a Tomlinson superintendent and one R. F. Petursson to defraud Her Majesty, The Queen, by deceit and falsehood. Peturrson is a federal highways inspector now at Victoria

Tomlinson returned from British Columbia by train at 6.20 this morning. He was reported vacationing when a warrant was issued against him by the Ontario attorney-general's office earlier this week.

FINGER PRINTEDD

He surrendered to the Port Arthur OPP detachment at 11 a.m. and was booked and finger printed. He was accompanied by T. P. Callon, local barrister who was acting as agent for G. Arthur Martin, Tomlinson's Toronto Lawyer.
