Make Threats Moves To Ont

TORONTO (CP) - The Toronto Star says today that an anonymous letter to world heavyweight boxing champion Rocky Marciano, threatening his wife and baby unless he throws his June 17 fight with Ezzard Charles, has driven his wife to take refuge in Ontario.

The newspaper says in a frontpage story that 23-year-old Mrs. Barbara Marciano and her 17month-old baby, Mary Anne, arrived "four days ago to visit some old friends living in Ontario."

The newspaper gave no clue as as to the Marciano's whereabouts but Star staff writer Angela Burke quoted Mrs. Marciano as saying today "she had never seen her husband so concerned before over an anonymous letter."

"Rocky has received a lot of crank letters and he doesn't get upset easily," Mrs. Marciano was quoted as saying: "But this is the first time he has ever been sent one in which the baby and I were threatened. It has scared us both to death."


