Water up to six feet deep flooded scores of buildings, including 75 factories, all the city's main stores, city hall, police and fire headquarters and the 150-year-old South Congregational church.

Some 50 families were evacuated from their homes.

The dam gave way under pressure of water accumulated during two weeks of an almost steady rain in New England. The water began to recede about six hours after the dam burst.

Hewitson Construction Co. Ltd. of Port Arthur bid \$331,950 for a job, received the contract, and was paid \$1,414,280, while the provincial government is holding back \$84.75.

It said Wolfe Construction Limited of Timmins, which held many contracts in the Lakehead area, bid \$423,250 on a trans-Canada highway section administered by the Ontario government and received \$1,171,542, with a holdback of \$18,607.

Fort York Construction Company bid \$276,925 and received \$431,413 on one job. The firm is headed by R. H. McGregor, Progressive Conservative member for York East. It held contracts on the Atikokan-to-Fort William road, a 77-mile stretch.
