Water up to six feet deep flooded scores of buildings, including 75 factories, all the city's main stores, city hall, police and fire headquarters and the 150-year-old South Congregational church.

Some 50 families were evacuated

The dam gave way under pressure of water accumulated during two weeks of an almost steady rain in New England. The water began to recede about six hours after the dam burst.
