said.

"Now J. D. Woods and Gordon
in their report to the committee re-
veal, among other things, that all
casual labor hired by the depart-
ment is being paid from this re-
serve account. Moreover, that cas-
ual labor has been hired at rates
above those paid to permanent de-
partment personnel; and the prac-
tise has grown up of crediting cas-
ual labor with working more hours
than they actually did so as to in-
crease the payments.

"In other words, at the very
time when the deposed deputy min-
ister suspected dishonesty among
his engineering staff, the govern-
ment itself adopted the extraordi-
nary procedure of setting up a spe-
cial highway reserve account.

"For a government, or its apolo-
gists, to plead innocence in face of
that combination of laxity and mal-
practice on its own part, is an in-
sult to the intelligence of the people
of Ontario."
