The Coroner's jury at Owen Sound, with reference to the mysterious Joll case, returns the following verdict: "That the said Wm. At the late North Bruce Conservative Convention, held in Tara, 14 candidates for the Local House were nominated. Thirteen retired in favor of Mr. John George, of Port Elgin.—[O.S. Advertiser.

At the meeting of sailors and steamboat men held here two weeks ago, it was resolved that the member for North Grey be requested to support Hon. Mr. Taylor's bill to prevent importation of foreign labor. The officers complain that as the law now stands American engineers and masters can come here, and on passing our examinations at once take charge of vessels; whereas a Canadian officer on going into the States must take the oath of allegiance and spend several years becoming naturalized before he is eligible.
