COUNTY AND DISTRICT.

Diphtheria is prevalent in Brant township.

Mr. Thos. Christmas, of Collingwood, died last week of cancer in the jaw.

Henry Hetherington, of Kinloss township, was drowned last week by breaking through the ice.

Mr. John Jeffrey, business manager of the Polson iron works, died in Owen Sound last week.

The Enterprise says a pig eight months old, near Collingwood, produced 320 pounds of dressed pork.

An Owen Sound Board of Trade deputation visited Ottawa last week to interview the Government upon matters affecting that town.

Mr. Thos. McGirr cut an elm tree on his farm this week, the butt of which measured twenty feet in circumference. The tree made four logs, the three smallest of which Mr. McGirr drew into McKechnies' mill yard here and received therefor fifteen dollars. The three logs contained three thousand feet. It was a monster elm and no mistake.—[Durham Chronicle.

Fred Hone, an Englishman, and John Martin, an Irishman, two able bodied men, applied at the Police Station to be arrested as vagrants, on Sunday last. They said that they had been tramping for a month and their clothing had become so filthy that when they were able to secure work they could not get a boarding house to take them in, and they wanted a month to get cleaned up. They were accommodated.—[O. S. Times.

SHOT HIM IN FUN.—Alex. Shields and Wm. Hindle, young farmers living on lot 18, 1st line east, Chinguacousy, were fooling with revolvers on Sunday afternoon last when Hindle said, in fun, "let's fight a duel," and leveling his pistol at Shields snapped the trigger, Shields doing likewise. Shields' firearm proved to be loaded, however, and a bullet was lodged in Hindle's chest just above the heart. Dr. Hall, of Brampton, was hastily summoned, and Hindle, in his ante-mortem statement, said he was to blame in suggesting the foolish deed. Hindle is doing as well as can be expected and will probably recover.—[Brampton Times.

A Minto sport, not five miles from Minto station, was the owner of a valuable pup. The animal was fond of a good warm place and upon every occasion when it found the door of the oven of the cook stove open it would crawl in. To break it off this habit the sport thought he would give it a fright and closed the oven door. A minute after a friend called and they went to the barn to put away the friend's horse. The stock was examined, etc., and the pup for a time was forgotten. Suddenly the sport thought of what he had done and with a bound that landed him seven yards out of the stable he made for the house like a wild Indian, leaving the friend in sore bewilderment in the stable. When the house was reached the oven door was opened and there lay the remains of the once valuable pup, ready to be served up. He says he will never forget the sight and will never go hunting again.

James Morton, the colored youth who was arrested last week for stabbing John Davis, appeared before the Police Magistrate on Monday morning, charged with feloniously wounding. The evidence all went to show that Davis went into his brother's ice house on Sunday afternoon for the purpose of putting out a crowd of boys who were playing there. Finding Morton there, he ordered him out, saying that he did not allow boys to play there, especially "niggers." He then gave the prisoner a shove toward the door. Morton then pulled a pocket knife out and ran at Davis who fell, and the prisoner plunged the knife into Davis' back, inflicting a wound about 2 in. deep and about 2 in. on the surface. The knife stuck in the bone, and the clothing had to be removed before the knife could be withdrawn. Dr. Lang gave evidence as to the nature of the wound, stating that if the stab had been inflicted an inch farther in one direction, paralysis would have ensued. He stitched up the wound and Davis was able to be about in two or three days after the occurrence. The prisoner was sentenced to one year in the Central Prison.—[O. S. Times.
