COUNTY AND DISTRICT.

Another mammoth skeleton has been found in Kent County by a Messrs. Hillhouse and Jelly. The Shelburne Economist visited the scene and describes the bones as follows:

Largest leg bone, 35 inches in circumference at joint, and 47 inches long; fore leg bones (shoulder blade to knee), 3 ft. 2 in. in circumference, 2 ft. 4 in. long; bone from knee to ankle, 2 ft. 10 in. in circumference, 3 ft. long; spinal vertebra, 16 in. across; spinal process (that is, upward extension on back bone towards the neck), 2 ft. 4 in.; atlas joint, on which the head is set, 19 inches across; shoulder blade, 3 ft. 1 in. long, 2 ft. 1 in. in widest part; complete lower jaw, teeth in it, and as perfect as when the animal died, length 6 ft., measured across, 2 ft. 3 1/2 in.; nasal bone, 2 ft. 1 in. in length; olfactory channel or nostril, inside measurement, 11 in. long, and 3 in. wide; surface of large teeth, 8 in. long and 3 1/2 in. wide; tusk, 9 ft. 8 in. long, diameter, 8 in. All are in a most excellent state of preservation.

An accident occurred in Hullett yesterday (Wednesday) afternoon, by which three estimable young men are believed to be fatally injured. Some young men were assisting Mr. Gavin Hamilton to pull down a barn on the old Mead farm, when a pulley plate fell on four of the party, Stewart Little, Gavin Hamilton, Alfred Cole and James Ball. Drs. Young and Sloan were shortly in attendance, when it was found that the three first had received so severe injuries to the spine as to preclude much hope of recovery. Ball's injuries are not serious. The lamentable affair has cast a gloom over the entire neighborhood.—[Blythe Standard.

A North Grey Incident.

KILSYTH, May 23.—One of the most amusing, as well as one of the most significant incidents of the campaign, occurred at Mr. Creighton's meeting here. He was opposed on behalf of the Grit candidate by a Dr. Horsey, of Owen Sound, who, when he came to the separate school question, dilated on how perfectly clear Mr. Mowat had made the law by his legislation of last session, and getting the Grit campaign book, commenced to read the Act. As he read and dilated on each clause, showing how perfectly clear and satisfactory it was, Mr. Creighton was observed laughing, when he turned round and attacked him, saying that was always the way with the Tories—when arguments were used which they could not answer, they tried to turn them off by laughter and ridicule. The mirth of the audience was uproarious when Mr. Creighton, after Dr. Horsey's address, showed that instead of reading Mr. Mowat's amendments he had actually read and praised Mr. Meredith's bill, which the Mowat Government and their followers voted down! Well-known reformers were called on the platform to say that there was no mistake about this, and the crestfallen doctor had publicly to admit it himself. At the close of the meeting a friend who came with him said he had noticed at the time that he was reading the wrong bill, when the doctor turned to him and in pitiful words said: "Why didn't you stop me?" The incident has got around and the valiant Grit stumper is now the butt of the community. The significance of the incident is that from such a source should come this unwitting tribute to the clearness and satisfactory nature of Mr. Meredith's proposals, which the Government voted down. Every honest Reformer believes just as Dr. Horsey evidently believes, though the latter now feels like kicking himself for publicly admitting it.
