An Awful Charge. Two Residents of Thornbury Alleged to Have Assaulted a Defenceless Girl.

THORNBURY, June 10.-This usually quiet town is to-day seething with excitement over the sensational story of hardship and brutality told by Emma Gardner, the 17-year-old adopted daughter of Samuel and Mrs. Friend. Friend, who for years has occupied the position of town constable, is reputed to be wealthy. He owns a blacksmith and carriage shop, and holds mortgages on several farms. Though married for some sixteen years, he has no children, and four years ago adopted Emma Gardner, the daughter of a widow who resides at Clarksburg, a village a mile distant. A young man named James Goldsmith, who works in Friend's blacksmith shop, has boarded in the house for two years past.

Mrs. Gardner states that when she allowed her daughter to go with the Friends it was with the understanding that she should be treated as one of the family, and that she should be sent to school during the day. For months Dame Rumor has been busy with the names of Friend, his wife and young Goldsmith, and Emma Gardner has been in consequence shunned by all the young girls of the village. Nothing of a definite nature, however, was known until yesterday, when Emma was seen flying from the house, and upon being questioned, told such a horrible story of repeated assaults and outrages that at first her charges staggered belief. The girl's mother, upon hearing of the affair, took her daughter before the mayor and swore joint warrants for the arrest of Friend and Goldsmith, charging them with rape. Both are under arrest now.
