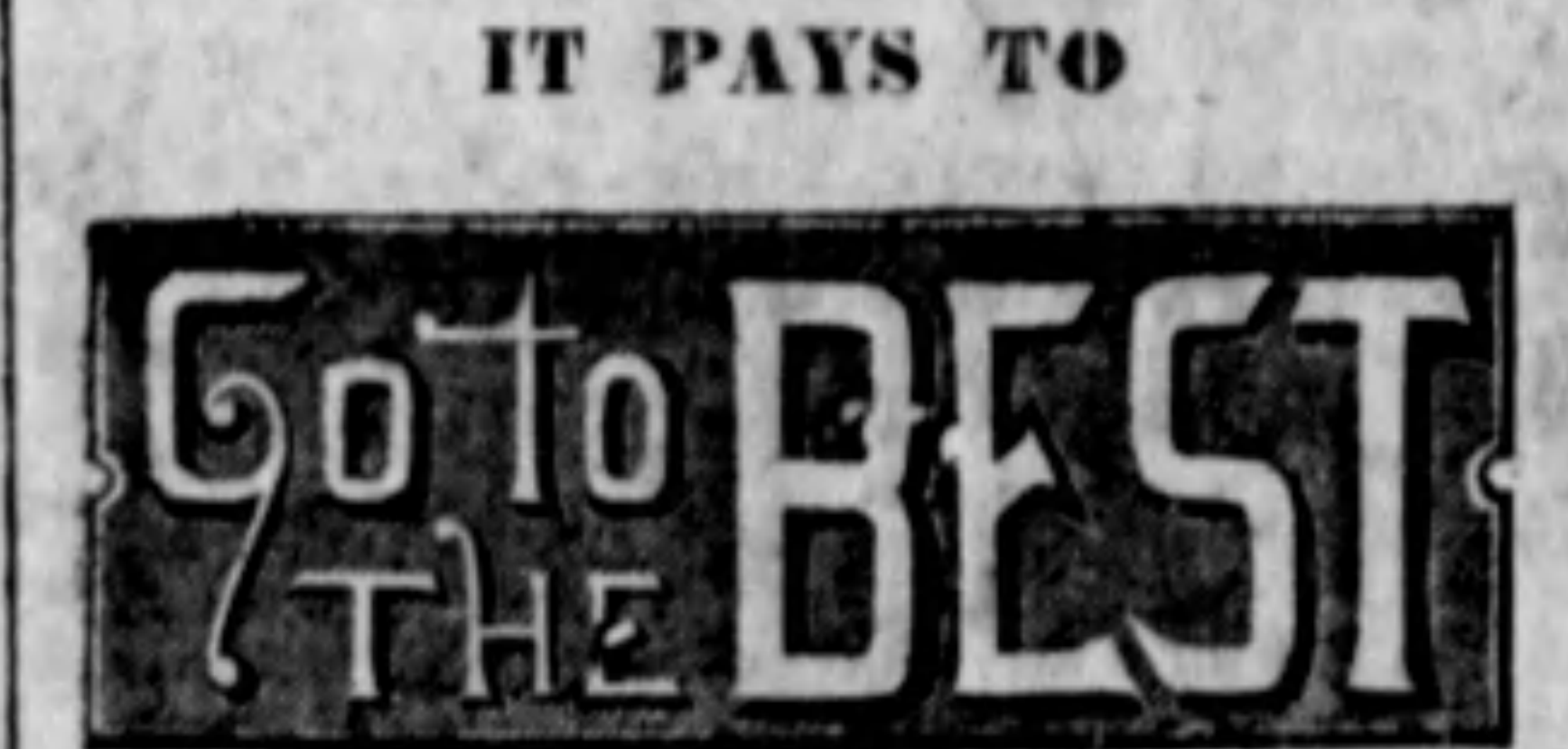

Walking Niagara.

A perilous feat was undertaken at Niagara Falls on Saturday last by a gentleman well known to many of our readers. S. J. Dixon, a photographer who lived some years in Clarksburg, made a successful attempt at walking a rope over the Niagara river.

Exactly at half past three o'clock, the time set, Dixon appeared. He was dressed in brown-colored tights and black silk trunks, and wore moccasins upon his feet. The pole he carried weighed barely 30 pounds, and was 22 1/2 feet in length, weighted at either end.

When he reached the centre of the gorge he lay down on his back on the slender wire, with his balancing pole under him. The spectacle of a human being standing upon such slender footing, before him the bare, rugged cliff, 250 feet beneath him the angry, surging waters of the great rapids waiting to swallow him should he make a false step, was thrilling in the extreme.

The time occupied by Peer over the same cable was nineteen minutes, and Dixon's time to-day is said to equal that of the famous Blondin. After resting a few minutes Dixon walked out from the American end about 200 feet with a wooden hoop around his ankles, giving a short exhibition to the spectators there assembled.

The wire rope was firmly secured by guys fastened to the rocks below and weighted with sandbags for the occasion by William Peer, brother of the once celebrated rope walker.

In conversation, Dixon said the task he to-day performed was much greater than he had any idea of. He remarked upon the difficulty of securing such a long stretch of cable so that it would not vibrate.

S. J. Dixon is 38 years of age, is five feet six inches in height and weighs 188 pounds. He was born in New York city, his parents being natives of Ireland. He lived during his youth and until he moved to Toronto in the village of Clarksburg, in the county of Grey.

Dixon says it is his intention to repeat this feat in the future, though he has been set as yet.
