GRAND TRUNK EXCURSIONS OF CANADA

For Manitoba and Pacific Coast Colonist Parties.

A series of one way excursions will leave Toronto at 11.00 p. m. on

April 17th, and May 1st,

The route being via North Bay, Port Arthur, Winnipeg.

The fares to be used will be the second class one way rates, contained in Joint Passenger Tariff to the Canadian North West (No. 3) and current supplements. A COLONIST SLEEPER will run through from Toronto to Vancouver with each excursion, and accommodation will be received in same for passengers going to Kamloops and West, on payment of an additional sum of \$2.50 per single or half berth (one half berth to the Section), which will give use of curtains, carpets, mattresses, pillows, comforters, etc., all the services of a porter through to the Coast. One double berth or two half berths will not be sold to one passenger to the exclusion of other passengers from the car, except by special arrangement.

When berths are required, it will be necessary to collect the extra charge, and forward an advice to Mr. P. J. Slatter, City Agent, Toronto, giving (1st) name of the person or persons for whom accommodation is required, showing number of adults, whether married or single, and number of children, age and sex; (2nd) amount paid; and (3rd) the point to which passengers will be ticketed.
